Purpose

To inform industry about how they can be involved in the QBCC Governance Review.

Background

The Department of Energy and Public Works (the department) has commissioned Mr Jim Varghese AM, a well-respected professional and Chancellor of Torrens University, to lead an independent review into the QBCC's governance arrangements.

The review will examine the roles and responsibilities of the QBCC and Queensland Building and Construction (QBC) Board, along with the policies, procedures, and practices to ensure the QBCC's governance arrangements reflect best practice for a regulator of this kind.

The review also builds on the work already undertaken by the QBCC to improve procedures and systems as it transitions into being an insights-driven regulator and review its dispute resolution and decision-making processes.
