# Amendment of Building Act 1975 Form 17 – Inspection of Pool and Fencing

# **Purpose**

To provide advice to building certifiers on changes to the *Building Act 1975* as a result of the introduction of parts of the *Plumbing and Drainage Act 2002*. These changes will take effect on 7 February 2003.

#### **Background**

The Government recently passed the Plumbing and Drainage Act 2002, which resulted in a number of amendments to the Building Act regarding swimming pool fencing.

# Legislative provision

An amendment was made to s14 of the Building Act (Outdoor swimming pools must be fenced), which will take effect on 7 February 2003.

Section 14 (2) now reads:

- '(2) Before a person fills the pool with water to a depth of 300 mm or more, the person must ensure—
  - (a) fencing that complies with the design, construction and performance standards (the "standards") prescribed under a regulation is constructed around the pool; and
  - (b) a building certifier has, after inspecting the pool and fencing, issued the owner of the land with a certificate in the approved form stating the pool and fencing comply with the requirements for pools and fencing prescribed under a regulation.'

Therefore, the building certifier must inspect and issue a certificate before the pool is filled.

#### **Approved Form**

Included with this advice is a copy of the approved Form 17 – Inspection of Pool and Fencing. This form must be used by building certifiers to certify the compliance of pools and fencing in accordance with section 14(2) of the Building Act.
