Energy Efficiency Seminars Class 2, 3, and 4 Buildings

The Building Code of Australia (BCA) 2005, which commences 1 May 2005, will incorporate new energy efficiency provisions for the design and construction of Class 2 (multi-residential) and Class 3 (hotels, motels, etc) buildings and Class 4 parts of buildings (residential unit in a non-residential building).

The Australian Building Codes Board, in conjunction with the Australian Greenhouse Office and the Department, will be holding nine Queensland half-day seminars during April 2005 to inform participants of the new energy efficiency provisions.

Participants will receive a CD ROM (containing a glazing calculator, modules, and PowerPoint presentation), a printed copy of the modules, climate map, BCA Subscription form and other relevant literature. The seminars will address:

- Building fabric
- External glazing (including use of the glazing calculator)
- Building sealing
- Air movement
- Lighting and power
- Hot water
- Access for maintenance
- HVAC

Building certifiers, architects, building designers, government agencies, industry bodies and any other interested practitioners involved in the building and construction industry.

New Energy Efficiency Provisions for Multi Residential Buildings INFORMATION SEMINARS

Important new energy efficiency provisions for multi residential buildings are coming into effect in BCA 2005 on 1 May 2005. As practitioners you need to know about these changes to Class 2, 3, and 4 buildings.

The ABCB, and the Australian Greenhouse Office, in partnership with State and Territory Governments are running a series of seminars near you in early 2005 to inform you of these changes to the Building Code of Australia (BCA).

The objective of the seminars is to present you with the facts and know-how to successfully apply the energy provisions of the BCA.

If you are involved in designing, building or approving multi residential buildings you need to know how these provisions will affect the way you work.

The aim of these provisions is to reduce the emission of greenhouse gases, and as a building operative you have a vital role to play today for the future.

On a day to day basis you will be called upon to do things a little differently from before. Your ability to work successfully with the new measures will be guided by your ability to understand the broad intent of the provisions and make the necessary practical adjustments to your work.

The seminars will provide you with an opportunity to learn the issues from technical experts. From an introductory overview through to specific issues you will be able to identify key areas for action.
