If a home owner does not take action to fix the breach, the park owner/manager may apply to the Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal (on 1300 753 228 or at www.qcat.qld.gov.au) to terminate the site agreement. If the park owner/manager fails to take action to fix the breach, the home owner/s may apply to the tribunal to obtain an order to compel the park owner/manager to remedy the breach.
